## \*\*\*PRESS RELEASE\*\*\*

From Thursday, October 14, 2021, through Sunday, October 17, 2021, Frostburg City Police logged 171 incidents and activities.

Incidents during this time period included:

- Four (4) arrests, including one criminal citation for theft, service of two arrest warrants, and one serious traffic charge for driving on a suspended license;
- Twenty-three (23) Civil Citations for violations of the City Code, consisting of open container of alcohol, excessive noise, and public urination violations;
- Twenty-Eight (28) traffic stops;
- Thirty-One (31) parking citations, 15 of which stemmed from a business complaint in which numerous motorists parked on the parking lot and left for a nearby bar, leaving the business insufficient parking for its customers;
- One (1) sexual assault allegation (allegation of non-consensual touching through the clothing);
- One (1) domestic assault;
- One (1) unattended death investigation;
- Eleven (11) requests for a police officer and Two (2) officer standby requests;
- Six (6) noise complaints and Six (6) disturbances;
- First-Degree Assault – On Sunday, October 17, 2021, at 1:05 a.m., a Frostburg Police Officer patrolling East College Avenue came upon a fight at a party, in which a large crowd was in the yard with some members yelling and fighting. Officers dispersed the crowd and restored order. Upon doing so, an 18-year-old male emerged from the crowd and reported that he was struck in the face by an unknown suspect. This victim sustained a broken jaw and was transported to UPMC Cumberland and later to Baltimore for treatment. Police are continuing to conduct interviews and investigate to identify the suspect.
